The Committee consisted of the Rev. Charles Brooks, Rev. Christopher T. Thayer, Rev. F. D. Huntington, Josiah Bradlee, Esq., Deacon Moses Grant, and Hon. Albert Fearing. That Committee has performed the arduous and delicate duty with strictest impartiality. They issued a private Circular, dated March 1, 1854, and sent a copy to each clergyman in Massachusetts, to each bishop of the Protestant Episcopal and Methodist Churches, and to as many other Ministerial Associations, Theological Seminaries, and Presidents of Colleges, in other States, as they supposed could feel interested in this local movement.
